



We successfully completed the first semester of testing with 97% of our students in compliance! **THANK YOU** for your support in following the processes in place for remote or on-campus testing. We want to take a moment to remind families that the final round of FAST Testing that happens in April and May <u>must</u> be completed <u>on campus</u> and remote testing is not an option. Your child will begin receiving specific emails about their assigned testing location and day beginning in February. If you have concerns about the date or location your child is scheduled to test, please reach out to us as soon as possible! We can accommodate most requests if we are given enough time to make the changes, however, the closer we get to testing day the less likely it is that we can make changes. Please schedule time once a week to check your child's OCPS Gmail account which can be accessed on Launchpad. If you're not sure how to check that account, <u>here</u> is a video with directions.

DEVICE DISTRIBUTION FOR SEMESTER 2!

Jan 9 to Jan 31 9:00 am to 3:00 pm

Full time students must be enrolled at OCVS in Skyward for 48 hours in order to receive a device. You can call 407 317 3327 option 1 to verify.. Devices cannot be distributed if a device is already checked out from another school. Please allow at least 20-25 minutes for device pickup. Students in grades 6-12 need to pick up their own device. A child in grade K-5 does not have to be present but is strongly encouraged to be present. Adults picking up devices will need identification. Only adults on the student's contact list may pick up devices for the child.

The 2nd Grade Universal Gifted Screener will take place Tuesday, January 23rd, and/or Wednesday, January 24th on the OCVS campus. Your child's second-grade teacher will send out additional information with the date/time for your child's gifted screener. The NNAT-3 screener is a computer-based screening tool purchased/provided annually by OCPS for all second-grade students. This is administered in a group format in a classroom or computer lab. We do offer gifted services at OCVS. We have an amazing resource gifted teacher servicing elementary students, Kathleen Jackson that can be reached at kathleen.jackson@ocps.net Please reach out to our staffing specialist Jamie Tice at Jamie.tice@ocps.net with additional questions about the gifted screener process or any questions regarding Gifted Services at OCVS.





WHO ARE THE GIFTED AND TALENTED?

Gifted and talented students are persons of exceptional promise whose capabilities predict contributions of lasting merit in widely varying fields. They come from all backgrounds with special abilities and talents ranging across a wide spectrum of human achievement. These students' abilities, talents, and potential for accomplishment are so outstanding that they require special provisions to meet their educational needs.

While high academic performance may be one of the most important signs of giftedness, it is also important to be aware of other potential indicators of superior intelligence. Some of these indicators are:

- advanced development of language
- advanced comprehension
- early development of sophisticated thought processes
- unusual capacity to manipulate abstract ideas and to process information
- superior ability to find, solve, and act on problems
- advanced levels of moral judgment
- unusual retentiveness and the capacity to learn at faster rates
- idealism and a strong sense of justice

Florida legislation has identified gifted learners as a part of the exceptional student education population since 1968. In Florida, students are eligible for exceptional education programs if they meet the criteria outlined in Florida Board of Education Rule 6A-6.03019, FAC. These criteria focus on a learner's need for the gifted education program, entry academic skills, general intellectual functioning, and various behavioral and intellectual characteristics.

If your child does not meet the specific criteria set by the state for gifted learners, Orange County Public Schools will strive to develop educational avenues designed for your child. Although they will not be served in the gifted program, our staff will be happy to work with the regular education teacher to support individual student needs.
