Lastly, I want to thank you for being an integral part of the OCVS family. Together, we will continue to achieve greatness.





4th Grade Visits the History Museum

OCVS 4th Grade students, parents, and teachers recently met up to experience the Orange County Regional History Center! During this time, students immersed themselves in historical studies of Black History and Excellence in Florida. including towns like Eatonville and South Apopka. They learned about the first Indigenous Tribes of Florida. As part of the experience, students also made clay pottery to emulate the pottery that an Indigenous tribe would make and explored the Pioneer Life exhibit. They also visited Dr. Phillip's Orange Grove to learn about the history of Florida's citrus industry. Students were immersed in a mock court trial, learned about court trials. roles of the judge, jury, prosecution, and defense. Finally, students explored the Florida Tourism exhibit, and witnessed the inventions of the Model T Ford, NASA, and Disney.

We want to take a moment to remind families that all testing from now until the end of the year must be completed **on campus**. <u>Remote testing is not an option</u>. **The only students who can continue with remote testing are our Kindergarten, First, and Second Grade students.


Valencia DUAL ENROLLMENT applications ARE NOW OPEN!!

ESE DEPARTMENT

ESE students age 14 and older are eligible for Pre-Employment Transition Services offered through Vocational Rehabilitation. They have a variety of services that guide students in achieving their postsecondary goals in the areas of **Self-Advocacy**, Workplace-Readiness Training, Work-based Learning Experiences, Self-Advocacy Training, and Postsecondary **Educational Counseling.**

The Florida Department of Education, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) works together with students, families, schools, community agencies and organizations to provide services that promote successful transitions from school to work and into adult life.

What is Pre-Employment Transition Services?

Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) offer students with disabilities an early start at career exploration and preparation for adult life.

Beginning at age 14, students with disabilities can connect with VR for Pre-ETS. VR works with students, their families, their schools, and community partners to enrich transition planning. In addition, VR supports students in gaining the knowledge and experiences necessary to make informed decisions about their future

Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunities Act (WIOA), every student ages 14-21 with a disability has the opportunity to participate in:

- Job-exploration counseling
- Postsecondary educational counseling;
- Self-advocacy training and peer mentoring; Work readiness training; and
- Work-based learning experience

Students with disabilities may participate in Pre-ETS without having to apply to VR or be determined eligible for services. The focus is to develop work skills, practice social skills and acquire a network of community supports while the student is still in high school.

The WIDA ACCESS test results show students' progress in acquiring the English language. The test results are also used as part of the criteria to determine exit ESOL services or receive a



BLACK STUDENT UNION

Our Black Student Union Club students recently attended the Zora Festival. America's longestrunning festival of the Arts and Humanities, in the historic town of Eatonville, FL. Eatonville is noted as the first Black incorporated municipality in the US, formed in 1887. Eatonville is the childhood home of famous author and film-maker, Zora Neale Hurston. Our students had the opportunity to visit the Zora Museum and attend performances that educated and celebrated African culture. African-American history, and Orange County, FL history through dance, song, poetry, and workshops. 




